

Charles “Chip” Becker, Esq.

Charles “Chip” Becker is an attorney at Kline & Specter, where he represents plaintiffs in personal injury matters. Mr. Becker has primary responsibility for the firm’s post-trial and appellate matters and practices regularly in both the Pennsylvania and federal appellate courts. He also works with the firm’s lawyers on a broad range of procedural and substantive issues as they arise during cases. In addition, Mr. Becker serves as a judge on the Pennsylvania Court of Judicial Discipline by appointment of Governor Wolf. He co-chairs the Supreme Court’s Historical Commission and vice-chairs the Supreme Court’s Commission on Judicial Independence. He previously served on the Supreme Court’s Appellate Courts Procedural Rules Committee and its Tricentennial Commission. Mr. Becker is an adjunct professor at the University of Pennsylvania Carey School of Law where he teaches state constitutional law and previously taught appellate practice. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Appellate Lawyers, a member of the American Law Institute, past president of the Third Circuit Bar Association, and a board member of the Philadelphia Trial Lawyers Association. A graduate of Williams College and Yale Law School, Mr. Becker served as a law clerk for Judge Sandra Lynch of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit.
